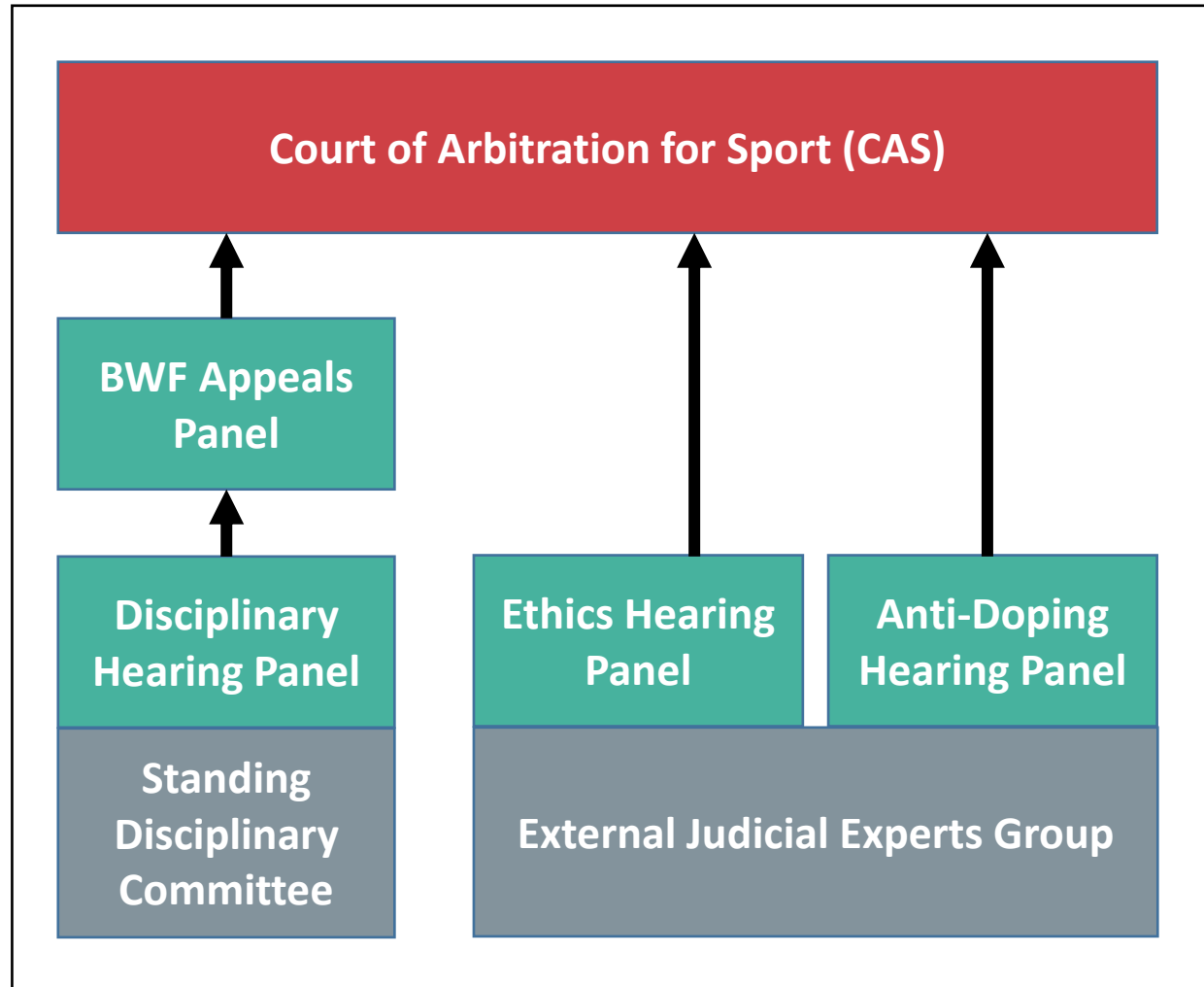

Judicial Provisions: Current situation



Current Judicial Procedures grew with BWF.

However:

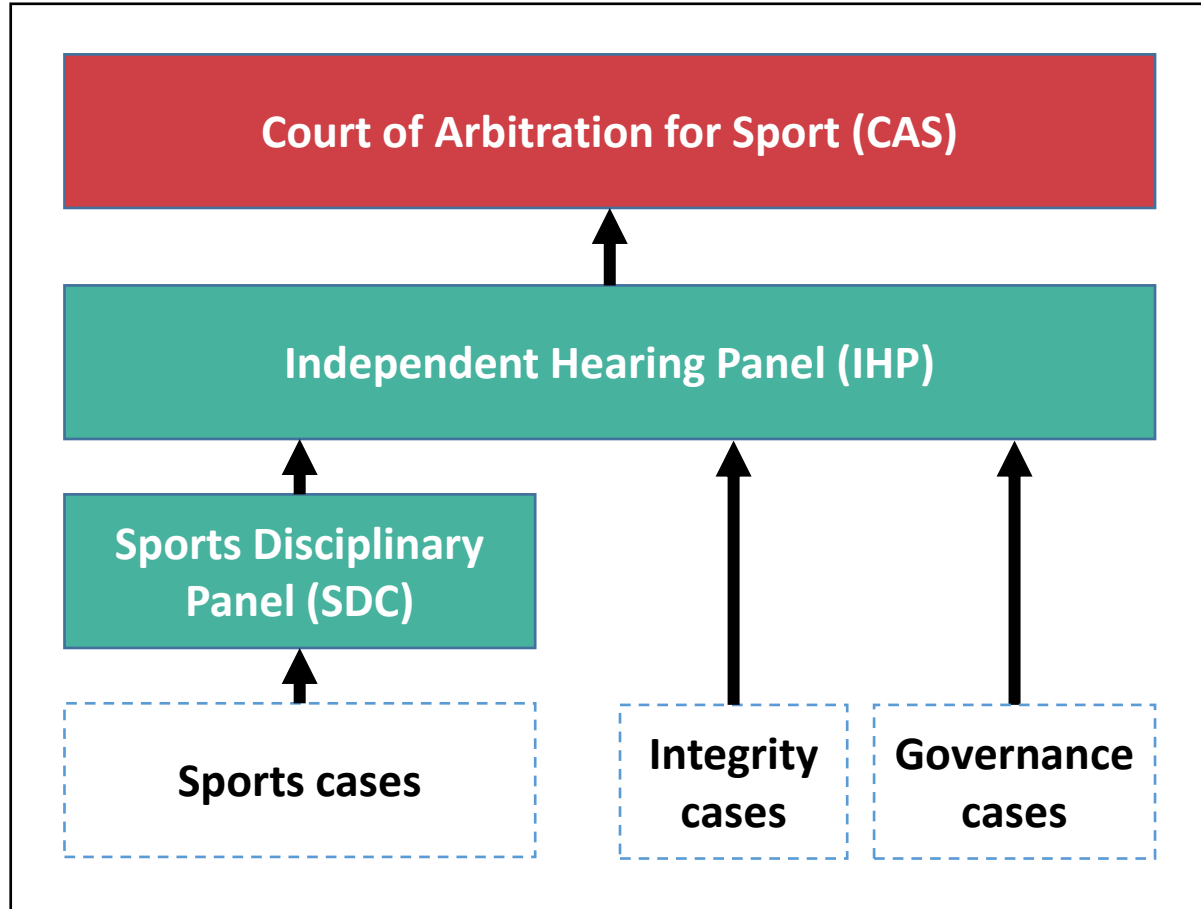
- Few appeals
- Redundant bodies
- Anti-Doping --> CAS
- CCs cannot use system

The 2020 Judicial Procedures

The Judicial Procedures were refreshed for current needs:

- ▶ **Reorganised and improved** judicial structure.
- ▶ **Continental Confederations** can use BWF system to deal with own cases.
- ▶ **Precise rules** on investigations and hearing processes.

A simplified judicial structure



Sports cases:

Codes of conduct for players, coaches, etc.

Integrity cases:

Code of Ethics, match-fixing.

Governance cases:

Challenge to elections

Proposal 5.3: Judicial Provisions



Why do MAs need to vote?

◀ Judicial Procedures

- ◀ Detailed and technical regulations. **Council responsibility.**

◀ BWF Constitution

- ◀ Legal framework for Judicial Procedures to exist. **AGM responsibility.**

The BWF Constitution needs to be updated to allow the Judicial Procedures to **enter into force.**

Proposal 5.3 – Judicial provisions (Amendments to the Constitution)

◀ **Proposal** (part 1 of 2)

- ◀ To approve amendments to the BWF Constitution to come in line with the 2020 Judicial Procedures.

◀ **Reasons**

- ◀ Constitution needs to be updated for the 2020 Judicial Procedures to enter into force.

Proposal 5.3 – Judicial provisions (Independent Hearing Panel)

◀ **Proposal** (part 2 of 2)

- ◀ To delegate the Council to appoint the President, Deputy President and members of the inaugural Independent Hearing Panel.
 - ◀ Subject to confirmation by 2021 AGM, inaugural term until 2022 AGM.

◀ **Reasons**

- ◀ The Independent Hearing Panel needs members to function until the 2021 AGM.
- ◀ For subsequent terms, the AGM will be asked to confirm the nominations put forward by the Council.
